	Green highlighting for areas that have not met or not fully met the success criteria and need to be improved. Written 'green' comment explaining "next learning steps".	A 'green comment' provides guidance for the next learning steps in order to "close the gap".

VF	Verbal Feedback	Shows where feedback has been given verbally.
G	Guided work with the teacher or learning assistant	This indicates that the students received adult support / feedback. The teacher should review this and ensure future planning builds on this.
I	Independent work	Further feedback will be required.
!	Indication of a 'slip' or 'error'	The student should correct the error made.
