	<p>Green highlighting for areas that have not met or not fully met the success criteria and need to be improved.</p> <p>Written 'green' comment explaining "next learning steps".</p>	<p>A 'green comment' provides guidance for the next learning steps in order to <i>"close the gap"</i>.</p>
Marking Codes (Quick marking)		
VF	Verbal Feedback	Shows where feedback has been given verbally.
G	Guided work with the teacher or learning assistant	This indicates that the students received adult support / feedback. The teacher should review this and ensure future planning builds on this.
I	Independent work	Further feedback will be required.
!	Indication of a 'slip' or 'error'	The student should correct the error made.
✓	Indication of a correct response

Underlined word <i>straight line</i>	Spelling error To be used for words student 'should' be able to spell at their age/ ability.	All students should correct high frequency words they have learnt from previous years.
Underlined word <i>wiggly line</i>	Grammar error	This should be used to highlight writing that does not make sense or an error with previously learned grammar skills.
